1. Introduction

Sofa Shoppr is WordPress based webshop (e-commerce) theme. It does include 3 major payment gateways to process user shopping basket at the checkout; PayPal, 2CheckOut and Authorize.net. In addition, e-mail orders are also supported. Beside the fact that this theme is extremely easy to setup and maintain, it does include all of WP 3.0+ features, built-in widgets, advanced layout control, user reviews, stock inventory and an ample Options page through which all the crucial sections of your future webshop are settable.

Another cool thing is a featured products banner rotator – Piecemaker (Adobe Flash app), fully integrated into system. Webshop owner can simply upload all the slides through WP Admin panel and set all of Piecemaker variables via theme Options page so no need to edit XML file or upload slides by using FTP client. On top of that, each banner can be linked to a certain/featured product page – if needed.

You can select 3 different layouts for your webshop Home Page; it can consist of Widgets only, it can be a grid of listed products (no sidebar) or a combo of grid and sidebar. Both grids may optionally be mixed with Widgets too which is another great feature – you can literally create your own layouts. There's plenty more but I guess you'll discover on your own as soon as you install Sofa Shoppr.

2. Requirements & Compatibility

Any JavaScript enabled Browser with the latest Flash Player will make this theme work with no issues! It has been tested on Firefox 3.6, Safari 5.0, Opera 11, Internet Explorer (6, 7, 8 PC) and Chrome 5.0.

3. Payment process and Stock Inventory

With Sofa Shoppr theme these two can work in synergy.

First of all, buyers can't buy a product that is out of stock nor buy larger quantity than currently available in stock.

Next, webshop Admin or Vendor is fully responsible for stock inventory maintenance.

However, no need to worry, the system will automatically notify Admin (email will be sent) about each product whose quantity is zero. The same will happen if someone wants to buy quantity that is beyond availability.

Before final checkout is made by a buyer A, stock inventory gets checked once again. Why? It may happen that buyer B already made a purchase in the mean time and certain product is not available any more. In order to prevent negative stock inventory values, buyer A order can not be processed; buyer A will rather be alerted about missing products. However, an exception **(negative stock value) still may occur**. Let's say both buyer A and buyer B are about to buy product X whose stock quantity is 2. Both buyers have product X quantity in their shopping baskets. While buyer A payment is pending gateway confirmation, buyer B order could get confirmed sooner (possibly different gateway) and thus product X becomes reserved for buyer B. There's no way to check stock inventory on gateway side so another 2 instances of product X become reserved for buyer A as well. In total, that's equal to 4 so negative stock value is literally a must.

Once an order is accepted (verified) by the payment gateway (PayPal, 2CO or Authorize.net), stock inventory gets updated (deducted from currently available quantity) for all of the products in buyer's shopping basket.

Upon each "low inventory alert" e-mail message, Admin or Vendor should update stock quantity of a product missing. It can easily be done from the special page "Stock Inventory" whose link can be found in each and every sidebar – but only if site Admin is logged in!

Beside 3 supported payment gateways, e-mail orders can also be accepted by Vendor. However, due to the fact e-mail orders didn't pass the payment verification and products in shopping basket are not actually paid, such order method doesn't affect stock inventory.


All of the accepted payment methods (3 payment gateways + e-mail order) will always be registered by the system and visible in "Orders Overview" page. On top of that, emails are always sent to both buyer and vendor as a transaction evidence.

4. Quick Setup

The following chapter contains **recommended** settings for this theme. It's good idea to keep them, otherwise certain offset in layout/functionality may occur. However, if you are familiar with CSS and PHP those deviations may easily be corrected or even upgraded.

Step 1 : Media settings

Select **Settings** > **Media** from Admin menu. I advise you to set all up as seen in below illustration. That's how you gonna keep nice and clean layout.

Step 2 : Permalink structure

Select **Settings > Permalinks** from Admin menu.

Sofa Shoppr uses custom permalink structure. It's really good for SEO and looks more friendly to your site visitors. So the only thing you need to do here is to select Custom Structure option and enter the following into input field (copy and paste):

`/%category%/%postname%/`



Step 3 : Create special page named 'Checkout'


Select **Pages > Add New** from Admin menu.

Checkout page will be used to make the list of all products in shopping basket. From there buyers will be able to edit everything related to a certain product (quantity, size, color), delete stuff from basket and continue to PayPal payment page.

Once you are OK with the content focus on right hand sidebar. From "Page Attributes" select Checkout Point Page and publish it.

Step 4 : Create special page named 'Orders Overview'

Select **Pages > Add New** from Admin menu.

This is another special page which must be created. **It will only be visible on front-end (not Admin panel) to a site Admin when logged in. Admins will be able to access this page via link displayed on the top of any available sidebar.** From Orders Overview, Admin will have an option to see order details as well as buyer info (address, phone, email...). In addition, Admin will be able to tag individual order as Pending, Shipped or Returned so this special page appears to be quite handy.

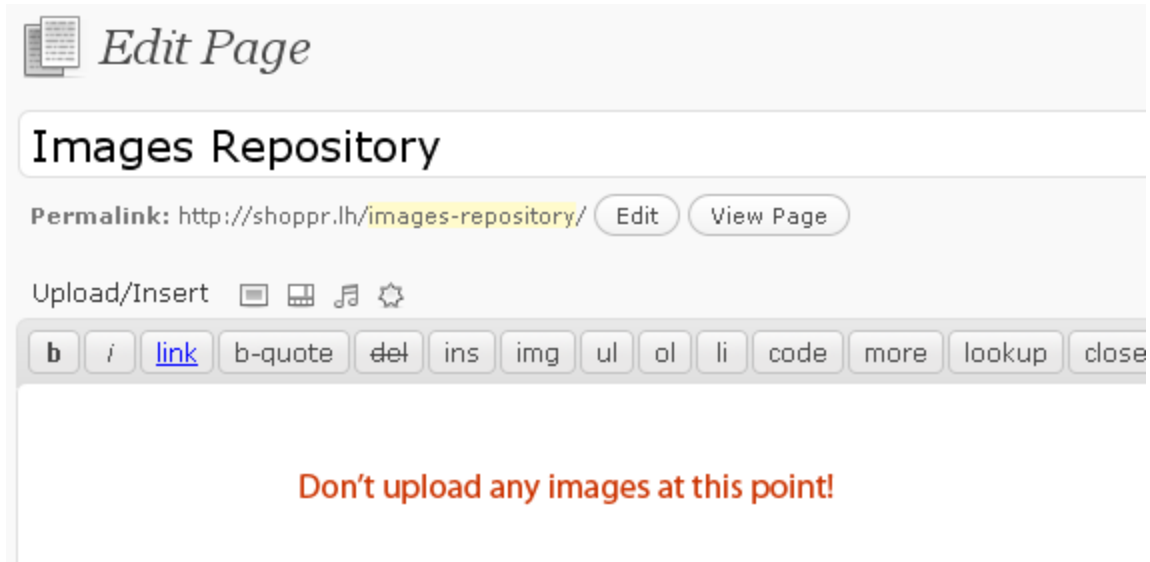
Once you are OK with the content of this page have a look at the sidebar again. From "Page Attributes" select Orders Handling and publish it.

Remember: don't add this page to your Menus (Appearance > Menus) because site visitors do not need nor can't reach such confidential information!

Step 5 : Create special page named 'Images Repository'

Select **Pages > Add New** from Admin menu.

This page is supposed to hold all of your rotating banner images. **At this point don't add any images! It is important to have this page present in the system and more about how to add images will be mentioned in "How to" section.**



Publish this blank page and go to next step. Remember: don't add this page to your Menus (Appearance > Menus) because there's no need for it to be accessible through navigation system.

5. Theme Options

Login to WordPress Admin, select Appearance > SofaShoppr Options

Each and every theme option is quite well explained so there shouldn't be any questions or issues regarding the usage. Many of them will work by default – except special pages (Orders Overview, Checkout and Images Repository) which MUST be precisely declared – as they are not by default!

Now swift through theme options carefully, one by one. Learn what each option is all about for the sake of your webshop functionality. The more you learn and memorize, the less question marks will float above your head.

No matter what you can always expect full support and assistance from my side!

6. Everything about adding a product to webshop

I guess you already have seen a demo site of Sofa Shoppr theme (<http://shopprnew.sofarider.com>). If you take a look at any product details page, you will find product images, description, price, quantity, size, color and related products. Of course, there are many other elements on product details page but we'll focus on these few only because you are the one controlling them!

1 : Add a new Product

Product = Post, that's the rule.

From main Admin menu select **Posts > Add New**. This will apply for each and every product you are about to add to your webshop.

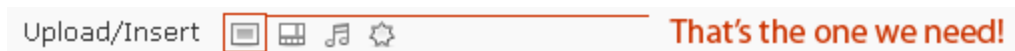
2 : Product Description

Text area will be used to add Product description so go ahead and paste some Lorem Ipsum.

3 : Product Images

The golden rule which applies to entire webshop is to use equal width/height images. 800X600px, 1024x768px, 933x505px – whatever you like, just keep dimensions consistent!

OK, let's say you've added product description already. Leave cursor at the very end of a text and click on the first button of "Upload/insert" buttons set. Mouse hover will read "Add an Image".



You can upload all product images at once if you like. Once you do so, modify appearance order and save changes. Now it's time to insert images to Product page (Post), one by one...

Now repeat the same for each next image of a Product. **Don't leave spaces between inserted images and don't hit Enter to place each one in the new row!** No worry about how everything looks messy in text editor because everything will look perfect in your webshop front-end :)

If you are ever about to delete/remove certain image from product details page, notice that "Delete" link next to "Insert into Post" button. That's how you'll properly delete image, it's not OK if you only remove it from text editor, REMEMBER that!

4 : Product Price, Product Size, Product Stock and Product Color

All of them must be added by using WordPress Custom Fields!

When adding a Product, scroll down a little bit until you spot the panel named "Custom Fields", it can be found below text editor. I guess everything will be clear enough with the following illustration.

REMEMBER!
size, price and stock Custom Fields are mandatory for each product in WebShop!
These 3 MUST always correspond to each other with no exception!

Hit "Enter new" for each non existing Custom Field or simply select it from drop-down menu (available only if created previously - at least once)!

Now, there are certain rules that you must follow with Custom Fields.

1. All the Custom Field Names must be written in lowercase (color, size, price, stock)!
2. size, price and stock are always mandatory for each and every webshop product!
3. If there's more than one value for "size" required, hit Enter on keyboard and bring it to new line!
4. If multiple values for "size" are used, correspondent values MUST ALWAYS exist in "price" and "stock" ("price" values can be redundant, no problems with that)
5. "price" must use dot if not integer, comma will generate an error (45.95 is OK, 45,95 is not!)
6. "color" will not affect the other three values - ever. It may contain multiple values as well but, generally speaking, different color should represent different product
7. Don't ever add a currency tag (USD, EUR, GBP, etc.) to price!
8. CUSTOM FIELD VALUES CAN'T CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING CHARACTERS: ^ | ; + ~ " ' ? = @ { } [] \ /

What if my webshop doesn't require Stock Inventory feature?

In that case you will still need to provide minimum value(s) for "stock" Custom Field. Remember, "stock" Custom Field is MANDATORY regardless your needs! **Any number larger than 0 (zero) will do fine.** Everything mentioned above (red colored text) will also apply if Stock Inventory feature is not required! Remember:

4. If multiple values for "size" are used, correspondent values **MUST ALWAYS** exist in "price" and "stock"

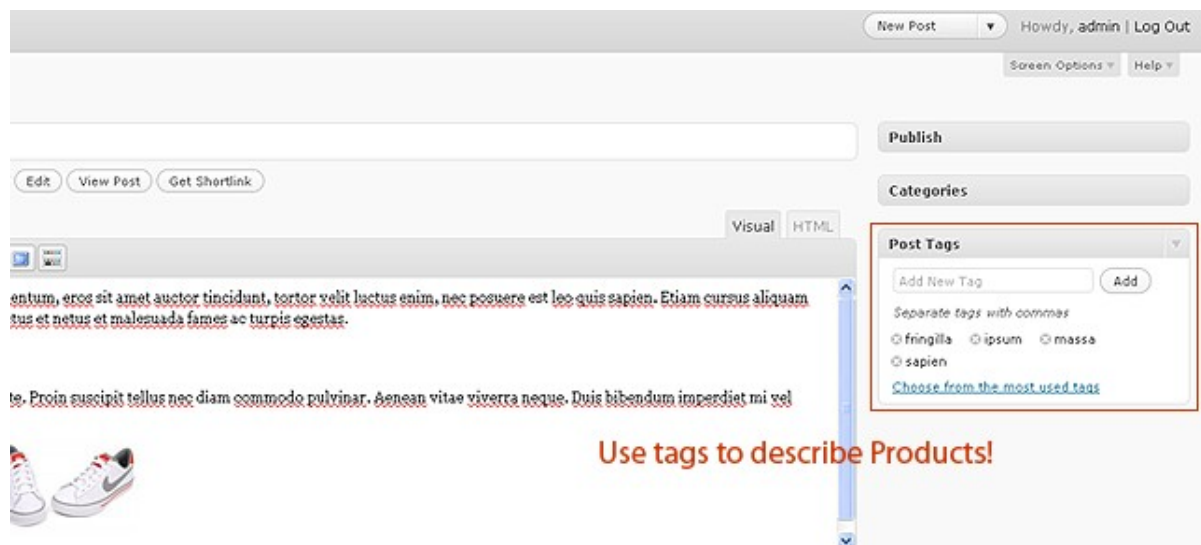
On a side note, please be aware that **you will need to disable the usage of Stock Inventory from theme Options page as well.** From main Admin menu select:

Appearance > SofaShoppr Options >> Stock Inventory

...and select "- NO -". Don't forget to save.

5 : Related Producs

They will be generated automatically, no worries about that part. What you should be aware of is the fact that Related Products are a result of tagging! Otherwise spoken, each time you add a new Product, use tags to describe it; color, size, manufacturer, model, etc. - anything that might help users to find similar stuff. How to add Product tags? Take a look at the photo below.



6. How to?

This section should provide all of the answers related to Sofa Shoppr theme which were not mentioned so far. My advice for non-advanced WordPress users is to read carefully. If you do so everything will be as clear as a day.

Of course, you might also have questions on how to do certain things in WordPress and such questions do not relate to Sofa Shoppr theme functionality or setup in general. In that case please refer to <http://codex.wordpress.org>, I bet you'll find everything you need to know. On a side note it's always good idea to visit YouTube if you are kinda lazy to read :)

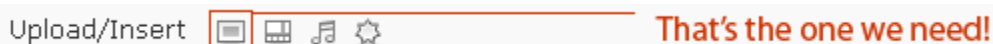
Quite often people have questions which relate to CSS and/or HTML. Unfortunately, this manual can not include or cover each and every aspect of technology used to build WordPress theme. That's why I'm here to help with all these small CSS/HTML/PHP tweaks rather than spending time on writting tutorials which can be found all over the internet.

How do I add images to Piecemaker – Flash banner rotator?

Remember that special page named "Images Repository"? Well, it's time to add some images to Piecemaker – Flash made banner rotator (**Note: the same is applied for Awkward, jQuery slider!**). All of your slides are supposed to be cropped individually to 920x280px because that's exactly the size of Piecemaker application. In "sofa_shoppr" theme root folder is a sub-folder named "PSD" inside of which is a PSD file "piecemaker_template.psd". You can use this one as a template and create your own slides. The minimum number of slides for Piecemaker is two, so don't expect to see that rotating cubes effect with one single slide :)

Now let's get back to WP Admin panel...

1. From Admin menu select **Pages > Pages >> Images Repository**
2. Hit the first button of "Upload/insert" buttons set



3. Browse to and upload all of your slides at once (just select multiple images)
4. Change the appearance order if you like by using numbers or arrange manually by dragging

Once uploaded, re-arrange if needed by dragging or assigning numbers to slides. Don't forget to "Save all changes"!

5. Notice that "Show" link next to each of your uploaded slides. Click on the first slide Show link in order to make this image options visible.

Hence the fact Images Repository is kinda special page made for the purpose of "feeding" Flash banner rotator, site Admin must be able to turn all images to links as well. There's not much point by featuring webshop products while there's no way to let users refer product details page, isn't it?

It has to be pointed out that an image options screen has been slightly modified in order to fit the needs of a single slide. Don't think it's an error, I did that in order to make things easier for an average user!

OK, take a look now what needs to be done for an each slide before insertion to Images Repository.

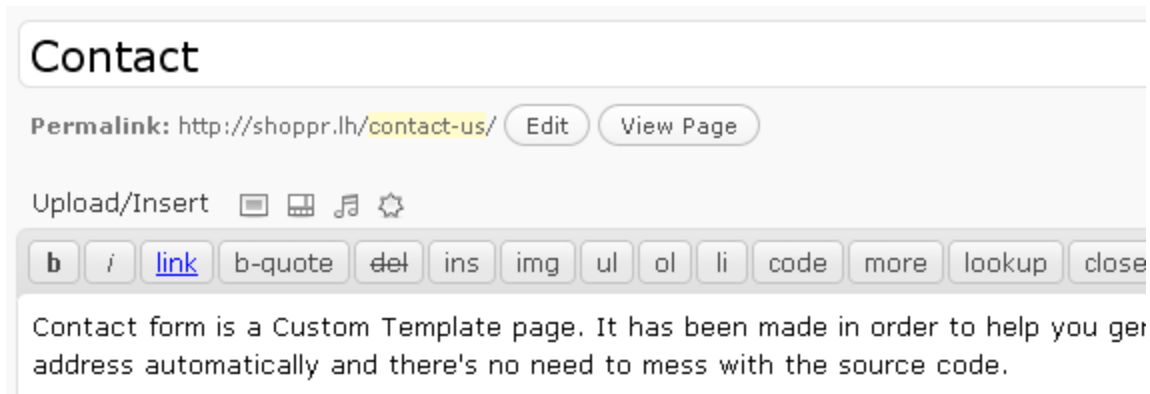

6. Enter full path link to a product details page if required (it's not a must to have it linked!)
7. Select "Full Size" option
8. Click "Insert into Post" button
9. Repeat the same procedure for each of your slides

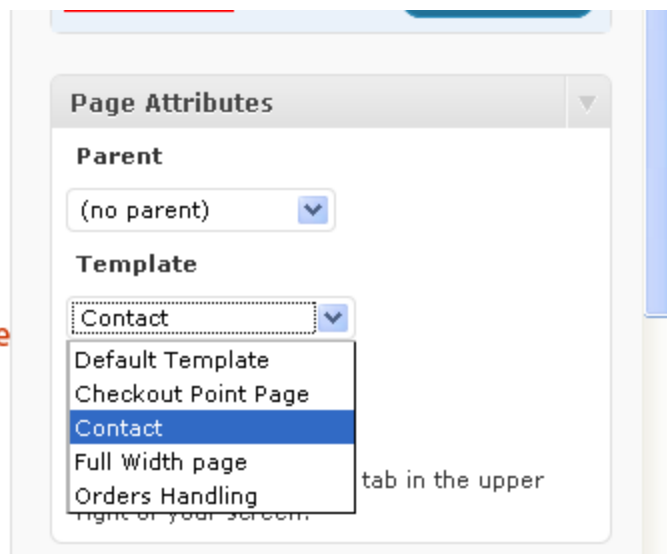
If you are ever about to delete/remove certain slide from Images Repository page, notice that "Delete" link next to "Insert into Post" button. That's how you'll properly delete image, it's not OK if you only remove it from text editor, REMEMBER that!

How do I setup Contact page?

In Admin panel select **Pages > Add New** from main menu. Title the Page with Contact or whatever you like, add some text/content if you want and right before you Publish it, from the right sidebar select Contact as a Template option – just like shown on the illustration below. This will make the contact form automatically show up on front-end. Form results will be sent to site Admin.

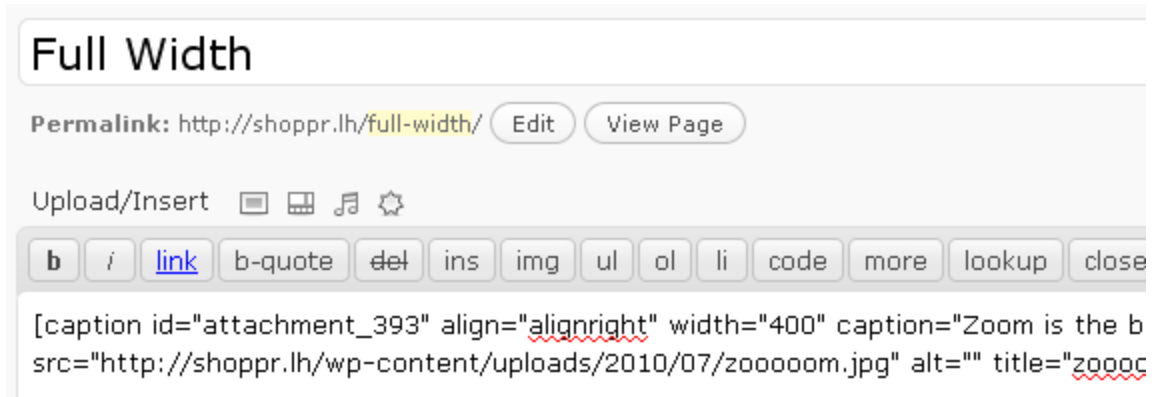


Select "Contact" from Template drop-down.

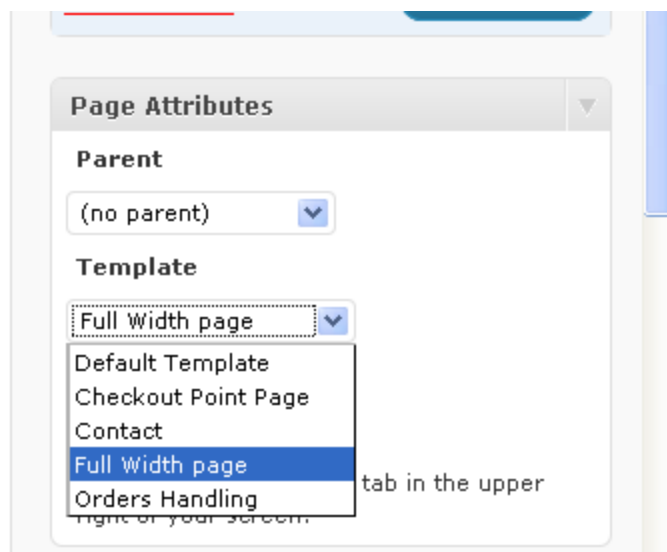


How do I add Full Width page?

Basically, adding Full Width page looks the same as adding Contact page. Just select **Pages > Add New** from main Admin menu. Title the Page, add some text/content/images and right before Publish, select Full Width page as a Template option. On the front-end you gonna see a page without sidebar.



Just select "Full Width page" from Template's drop-down.



How do I add/use Widgets?

In order to access Widgets section of WordPress Admin select **Appearance > Widgets**.

On the right hand side you gonna find the list of 8 different sidebars which are widget-ready. One of them is named "Home Page" and it's not exactly a sidebar but rather widget ready area only.

Now, on the Widget list (left hand side, larger area) you can notice 8 different Widgets starting with 'SOFA'. Drag and drop widgets from left to right in order to add them to different sidebars. And that's all you gotta do. Don't forget to tile each widget.

Of course, you can use other, default widgets as well but SOFA widgets have been styled to match theme's look.

Things you should know about SOFA Adverts Widget

This Widget is used to hold a chunk of HTML code which actually represents the list of 125x125px clickable banners. It means that you should add the code on your own. I guess it shouldn't be a problem for anyone but, in order to ease your job, here's a sample code. Just copy and paste into widget.

How do I localize/translate this theme properly?

This theme takes behalf of WordPress' built-in GNU gettext framework (<http://www.gnu.org/software/gettext/gettext.html>) and can easily be translated in such manner.

So, how to start?

It's quite simple – believe it or not. First of all go to <http://www.poedit.net/> and download this mini application made for the purpose of translation. It's free and cross-platform ready. After installation open 'sofa_shoppr' theme folder and spot sub-directory named 'theme_localization'.

It contains 'sofa_shoppr.po' file which can be opened with Poedit – an app you just have installed.

Translate all the phrases found in 'sofa_shoppr .po' and save new file as locale. What is locale?

A locale is a combination of language and regional dialect. Usually locales correspond to countries.

For example, let's say you are translating this theme to French. You will have to save it as 'fr_FR.po'.

However, in case you translate it to Brazilian Portuguese, you gonna save it as 'pt_BR.po'. Take a look for more examples here: http://codex.wordpress.org/WordPress_in_Your_Language

After saving translated file, you'll find additional namesake with the different extension - ".mo".

That's the one we actually need! You can leave ".po" file in 'theme_localization' folder but ".mo" has to be copied to 'sofa_shoppr' theme root folder. Do it now!

In case you already use localized version of WordPress and a locale of Sofa Shoppr theme corresponds to the locale of WordPress – your job is done. Otherwise you'll have to do the following:

1) open 'wp-config.php'. This file can be found in root of your WordPress installation. Have a look:

2) open 'wp-config.php' in some text editor, preferably the one capable to display line numbers

3) go to line #72 (WP 3.0 +), it currently reads:

define('WPLANG', '');
```

4) in case you have saved your translation file as 'fr_FR.po', you gonna change it to:

define('WPLANG', 'fr_FR');
```

...in case you have saved your translation file as 'de.po', you gonna change it to:

define ('WPLANG', 'de');

...in case you have saved your translation file as 'pt_BR.po' you gonna change it to:

...etc, etc, etc.

5) save 'wp-config.php' and re-upload if required

Once again: In order to make your localization work, “.mo” file needs to be present in 'sofa_shoppr' theme root folder! In case you are stuck with it – don't hesitate to drop me an email!

How to add different shipping prices for different countries?

Open “sofa_shoppr” folder first. There's a file in folder root named “**shipping_list.php**” so open it and have a look at existing/default list. Modify this file to fit your needs by following existing pattern of code. Always leave the first option ("Select shipping country" => "0") as is – unless you need to translate “Select shipping country” string. The very last country-price pair should never contain comma at the end, otherwise an extra empty option will be created!

FAQ

And finally: Frequently Asked Questions :)

I have upgraded Sofa Shoppr theme and “Orders Overview” page does display 0.00 as a price Total for all the previously made orders. What happened?

Shoppr theme passed through a major upgrade, it was unavoidable for this part to lose certain information. However, each and every new order placed after theme upgrade shall be displayed correctly. I deeply apologize for any inconvenience!

How do I replace Theme's default logo with my own?

If you take a look at “sofa_shoppr” theme root folder you gonna find sub-folder named “images”. Look up for a file named “site-logo.png”. Simply replace default one with your own. Keep file name and file type – PNG (32-bit with alpha channel is OK too).

How do I manually install new database table required for this theme? Installation from theme Options failed.

Well, you'll have to do it manually from **phpMyAdmin**. Most servers use Control Panel to allow users domain/hosting administration. On your Control Panel must be a link to **phpMyAdmin** which is used to manage MySQL databases. Click on it, log in if required and from the list of databases (left hand side menu) select database you use for Sofa Shoppr theme. Now...

1. From available top tabs select 'SQL'. It should be the second tab...
2. Paste the following queries into input field:

) ENGINE=MyISAM DEFAULT CHARSET=utf8;
```

Please note **wp_** prefix marked red! Your tables do not necessarily have to use that prefix. In case other tables in Sofa Shoppr database do not start with **wp_** you'll have to replace it with your own! Many hosting providers offer One Click Install of WordPress and I bet all of your tables will not start with **wp_**.
